Science News

Year 8 VALID test

The Year 8 VALID test (Validation of Assessment for Learning and Individual Development) will be held on Monday 4th November for all Year 8 Science students. This is an interactive, multimedia test completed entirely on a computer. Students will need to bring their own earphones that can plug into a school computer. This test is assessing Stage 4 outcomes from the NSW Science syllabus. Please see the following Parent/carer letter for more details.






















Year 11 into Year 12 Parent Information Night

Dear Year 8 Parent or Carer

The Validation of Assessment for Learning & Individual Development (VALID) test for Year 8 students will be held between Monday 28 October and Friday 8 November 2019. The test takes approximately 70 minutes. The VALID Science 8 test is an interactive, multimedia test completed entirely on a computer. At South Sydney High School, the VALID 8 Science test will be held on Monday 4th November periods 1 and 2.

VALID Science 8 contains multiple choice, short response and extended response tasks that are grouped around real-world issues, including scientific investigations. This is a diagnostic test, with tasks framed on Stage 4 outcomes and essential content in the NSW Science Years K–10 Syllabus. Students will be tested on their:

- knowledge and understanding of science
- understanding and skills in the process of scientific investigation
- ability to evaluate evidence, make judgements and think critically
- ability to access information and communicate scientific ideas.

Students also complete a survey about their opinions, attitudes and values about science.

Since students complete *VALID Science 8* on a computer, each student needs to bring **headphones or earbuds** that plug into a school computer. Earbuds for an iPod or portable player are suitable.

If your child has a disability that needs special consideration or has been educated in English for less than one year, please contact your child's school to discuss special provisions or possible exemption from the test.

Results of the test will be available during Term 1 2020. Information about each student is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that the right to privacy of all students is maintained. A personal report for each student will be sent to parents/carers to describe the science knowledge and skills demonstrated by the student in the test. There will also be information about how your child's results compare with overall performance of all students in the test.

The principal of your child's school is able to provide you with more details about the VALID program if you require additional information.

Junior SSCIM Camp 2019

South Sydney High School's approach to gifted and enrichment pedagogy is focused on providing extension and in depth learning opportunities to students in areas of their interest and aptitude. Project based learning is an area of strong focus in this regard and this area of learning is supported by our annual SSCIM Camps. From Wednesday the 30th of October until Friday 1st November Year 7 and 8 students will be joined by a contingent of our International students who will be completing learning projects that will take advantage of the beautiful national park setting for our camp in Pittwater.

Mr Armanios from our school's Mathematics department will accompany Ms de Paor to facilitate and work with the students on this camp, an annual highlight of gifted programs at South Sydney High School. Projects that the students will be completing include musical composition, portfolios of photography, video making and landscape drawing.

This camp requires much of the planning and organisation for our days at Pittwater YHA to be undertaken by the students.







Enrichment Term 4 and School holidays

During Term 4 we have a number of planned occasions to both offer our students enrichment and extension beyond the classroom as well as to celebrate their achievements. These include:

Wednesday 20th November: Stage 4 Enrichment Acknowledgement: We will be distributing certificates to our Year 7 and 8 students who maintained their membership of our Enrichment stream during 2019. We will also share some of the work undertaken during our annual Junior SSCIM Camp with parents and our school community.

Duke of Edinburgh Award


Congratulations to 2 more of our students, Hope and Andrew, who have achieved their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Say NO to Cruise Ships in Yarra Bay!

Yarra Bay & La Perouse beaches and parkland are under threat. The Berejiklian government is planning to build a Mega Cruise Ship Terminal in beautiful Yarra Bay.

Mega Cruise Ships are 360m long, 60m wide, and higher than the Eiffel Tower. They carry nearly 7000 people! Gladys wants the terminal to berth two of these monsters at a time.

Giant wharves and breakwaters will stretch across the bay. Beaches and parkland will be concrete - lost to terminal buildings, parking areas, and other infrastructure.

Dredging will destroy the remaining beaches. Yarra Bay and Frenchman's Beach will be lost to commercial interests. No more swimming, sailing, diving, fishing or picnicking in the Bay, it will be gone forever.

This will lead to more crowding at other eastern suburbs beaches as the throngs of visitors move north.

The Berejiklian Government is proposing this theft, all under a cloak of secrecy, and entirely for the benefit of foreign cruise lines. To save our beaches and parklands, stand up and say <u>NO</u> to the Berejiklian government putting commercial interests before people.
