**Tournament of Minds** is a voluntary problem-solving program for teams of seven students. This program requires creative, collaborative and divergent thinkers. Participating students need to be chosen from Years 7-10. The students work towards responding to Challenges from four disciplines including STEM; THE ARTS; LANGUAGE LITERATURE and SOCIAL SCIENCES.

Students undertake training during one lunch time per week before being chosen to compete in the Regional Tournaments which take place on a weekend in late August,2020 at a venue nearby. Carers need to provide their own transport for the students on that day. Successful participants may then proceed to the National Finals.

Selected students complete a Spontaneous Challenge followed by a Long Term Challenge from the four challenges listed earlier on Tournament Day. The students have six weeks to prepare for the presentation of the Long Term Challenge. This event should provide an exhilarating spectacle and the ingenious solutions created by motivated students who have accepted the Tournament Challenge.
